THE IMPACT OF SEXUAL AROUSAL ON SEXUAL CHOICES IN WOMEN

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Introduction

- 75 % of adults regret at least one sexual activity
- Sexual acts are often carried out in the "heat of the moment" and against one's better judgment.
- Sexual disinhibition: greater likelihood of engaging in unsafe, morally questionable or otherwise non-preferred sexual behaviors

Research questions

- 1. Does sexual arousal lead to sexual disinhibition in women in general?
- 2. Does the degree of sexual disinhibition depend on the degree of sexual arousal?
- 3. Do sexual excitation, sexual inhibition and/or sexual arousal impact sexual choices?

Method: Psychophysiological study


Sample description

58 androphilic women M age = 25.2, SD = 4.6 60 % in steady partnership 90 % have no children 75 % students


Assessment of sexual choices

Unusual Sexual Behavior Inventory (USBI, 20 items, α = .77)

Items from different sources (e.g., Ariely, 2006) that include unusual or socially sanctioned sexual behaviors, e.g., sleeping with your friend's boyfriend, sex with a very unattractive person, spanking, anal sex



The following predictors had no impact on sexual choices

- sexual function
- body imageage
- porn exposure
- depressive symptoms
- general health
- hormonal contraception
 - partnership status

Answers to our research questions

- 1. No. Our sample showed no general sexual disinhibition in the sexual arousal condition.
- 2. Maybe. There is a trend towards more sexual disinhibition with increased physiological sexual arousal.
- 3. Yes. Sexual excitation is a positive predictor of sexual choices regarding non-preferred sexual activities.
