## Sexual satisfaction partner-related factors

- is more than the absence of sexual problems is influenced by individual, relationship, and
- > Couple's data is needed to identify which factors contribute most to a satisfying sexual life

Which individual, relationship, and partner-related factors predict sexual satisfaction within partnerships?

## Method and Sample Description

950 mixed-sex couples (age: M = 51.4, SD = 12.7) - Representative of the German adult population

- Telephone recruitment; online or paper-pencil participation

## Frequency of sexual activity with a partner **≡** actual 40% preferred by 30% women preferred by 20% men 10%



- are less distressed by sexual problems
- have more frequent sex with their partner
- do not wish sex more often than their partner
- have better sexual communication Sexually satisfied women

## have a partner that is not distressed by

- sexual problems are in longer relationships

- ✓ Age has no direct impact on sexual. satisfaction
- ✓ Sexual function is important for sexual. esticfaction ✓ To want more sex than a partner.
- reduces sexual satisfaction
- ✓ Satisfied couples have sex more often
- ✓ Satisfied sexual partners talk openly about sexual concerns and wishes
